Dr. Willis M. Rapp

Willis M. Rapp holds the B.S. and M.M. degrees in Music Education from West Chester University, the Diploma of Fine Arts in Conducting from the University of Calgary in Alberta, Canada, and the Doctor of Musical Arts in Instrumental Conducting from the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC. Dr. Rapp has served on the faculty of Millersville University, Southeastern Louisiana University, Iowa State University, and Kutztown University, where he retired in 2013 with the distinction of Professor Emeritus. In 2007



he was the recipient of the Kutztown University Faculty Research Award, and in Fall 2009 he was honored with the Arthur and Isabel Wiesenberger Faculty Award for Excellence in Teaching, making him the first faculty member in the history of the university to be honored with both awards. He has worked with RMF as an educator, adjudicator and Music in the Schools director. For the past several years Dr. Rapp has worked with the Kutztown Foundation and Kutztown University to establish the Wells-Rapp Center for Mallet Percussion Research at Kutztown University. The Center was a \$6.4 million project, and includes a 2,100 square foot performing space in addition to rooms dedicated to each of the specialized collections of rare marimbas, xylophones, vibraphones, bells, and chimes currently in the collection.



About RMF...

RMF believes that every child in Berks should have access to high quality music programs, and events like Berks Shines allow us to make that possible. Not every student musician will become a professional musician, but the skills they've learned through choir and band room will play an important role in whatever direction they choose. Students who participate in music have a tangible advantage when it comes to developing a strong work ethic and positive attitude.

Over 95 years old, RMF is a public charity that provides financial support for music presenters in Berks County, music scholarships by audition and in response to financial need, and extensive music outreach, including programs in most of Berks County's public and parochial schools. RMF is governed by a self-perpetuating board of volunteer trustees and is administered by a staff of two full-time employees and two part-time employees. The Foundation depends upon the public's support each year.

RMF's annual efforts to support music education and appreciation include:

- Investing more than \$250,000 in scholarships for Berks County student musicians, divided equally between audition-based awards and awards that respond to financial need.
- Support local music organizations with \$200,000 in program grants that advance and advocate for music education and appreciation.
- Advocating for Berks County's strong music network, from strengthening the capacity of school music programs to economic development found in the arts as well as community access to concerts and ensembles.
- Ensuring quality instruments are available to students, regardless of their ability to afford them through Operation Replay, RMF's instrument recycling program sponsored by Zeswitz Music.
